

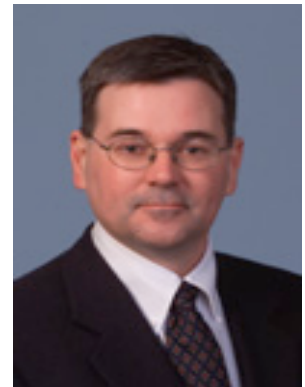
## **History of Medicine Speaker Series, 2009-2010**
